White Cross Walkers COMPO'S CRAWL

P.T. 93. 10 Km.

Centre and the Library. Charges start at £1 for 3 hours. Parking is free for
disabled badge holders and free for all on Bank Holidays.

ROUTE DESCRIPTION (Last Revision 31/07/16)

1. Leave the Tourist Information Centre and turn right. Take the first left
turn (No Entry signs) and cross the bridge. (Norah Batty's house with the
iron railed steps, is to your right.) Go ahead up the steep path to the left of
the Elephant & Castle P.H. At the end of the path turn right uphill, pass-
ing a well on your right, to reach the road. Turn right on road for 0.8 Km.
passing a cemetery on your right

**Question 1: There is a notice on the cemetery gates. What is the name
of the church shown on it?**

2. Continue forward on the road. Just before you reach a stone building on
your right (a former barn in process of conversion to a house), turn left on
a track with street sign, "Ward Place Lane". Pass through a group of
buildings (Ward Place) in process of restoration and continue climbing,
now on an enclosed path, to reach a track. Turn right on the track and ig-
nore paths left and right to reach a road junction. Go ahead on Cartworth
Moor Road for 0.8 Km. passing a cricket pitch to your right then a foot-
ball pitch to your left.

**Question 2: To the right of the road, opposite the football changing
hut is a track with a metal barrier. Which quarries are named on the**

on the sign on this barrier?

3. Continue on the road to reach the entrance to Moorland “mistake” Farm where the road surface deteriorates and it becomes a track.

Question 3: Opposite the farm entrance is a wooden telegraph pole. What are the numbers shown on the 3 white plastic discs about two metres up the pole?

4. Go forward for a further 1 Km. to reach a road. Cross the road to enter a track, opposite. Go ahead on track for 1.1 Km. passing trees to your left, to reach a sharp left hand bend (with seat). Leave track to go ahead through small wooden kissing gate and continue on footpath between walls. Go through another wooden kissing gate and follow right hand wall, heading right, for approx. 35 metres to reach a path junction, Turn sharply left downhill on the grass path to a T-junction with another path/track.

5. Turn left on path/track, initially with wall on right. Go through a gateway and continue with path until it turns right to a stile. Cross stile, then immediately fork right on path with a gully on your left. Go ahead on path soon with stream on your right. When stream passes under your path go forward to reach a T-junction with a track. Turn left, passing between gateposts, soon with a picnic area to your left, to reach a stile on to the road alongside a reservoir.

6. Turn right and go down road for 1.1 Km. initially with reservoir on your left. After double bend take right fork, Dobb Top Road, and continue to junction. Stay on Dobb Top Road which soon swings down into a dip, bends sharply left, and begins to ascend the other side of the dip. At next road junction turn left and follow Dobb Lane downhill.

Question 4: What is the name of No. 38, the 2nd bungalow on the left hand side of the road?

7. Continue ahead to cross bridge over river and continue on road, now with houses on your left and river to right. Take the first right turn, at a footpath sign high up on a lamp post, into Water Street (there is no street name board but it is opposite Old Road)

8. Continue to the far end of the houses, pass parking area on your left and turn right over footbridge. Immediately turn left on path, alongside river to cross a dry-stone wall. Fork right on path which veers uphill over uneven and possibly wet ground to enter the wood on a small path, slightly sunken at the start, approx 10 metres left of wood corner.

9. Go uphill on path which winds through wood, crosses a stream; swings right then then left to cross another stream and emerges into a field via a gap in an old wall. Turn immediately right to pass through a squeeze stile and follow path uphill.

10. At the fork take left hand path, still going uphill, initially through holly trees, to reach old quarry. Continue on narrow path, through trees. with quarry face to your right. Path eventually widens and becomes paved in parts, as it slowly descends through more trees and crosses a stream. Ignore paths to left and right and go ahead to reach the wooden boundary fence of a housing estate on your left,

11. Go ahead, with fence on your left, to the end of the houses and turn left, then left again, to reach estate access road. (More houses are being built on the right) Turn right on road to reach Woodhead Road with the “Catch” Fish Restaurant to your left. Turn right on road to return to the Tourist Information Centre & Library.
